

Exclusions

As schools return to full time provision we shouldn't under estimate the challenges children might face in their 'transition' back into school post Covid.

A recent report considers the potential new and heightened risks for school exclusions caused by the recent Covid-19 pandemic. Over-represented groups include children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), from particular ethnic backgrounds and those living in areas of high deprivation. We know the impact of Covid-19 on schools is substantial for practitioners and students. The social and emotional disruption caused by the pandemic and the subsequent school closures is highly likely to have increased or exacerbated student anxiety and other mental health issues. There is also a concern with school connectedness for vulnerable students whose patterns of school attendance have been disrupted. These concerns raise issues around transitions back to school settings.

As a Trust we would urge schools to consider this report. The report included the following elements:

- What are the heightened risks for exclusion as schools restart?
- Which students are at risk?
- How can we mitigate these risks?
- Who needs to act, when and how?

No Knives Better Lives Support Programme


