Change of name documents - for any changes in name	
Letter from headteacher or college principal - UK for 16-19 year olds in full time education; only use in exceptional circumstances if other documents cannot be provided - must still be valid	
Cards carrying the PASS accreditation logo UK and Channel Islands - must still be valid	
EU National ID Card Must still be valid	
Authority giving entitlement UK & Channel Islands eg from the Department for Work and Pensions, the Employment Service, Customs & Revenue, Job Centre, Job Centre Plus, Social Security - less than three months old	
Benefit Statement UK - e.g. Child Allowance, Pension - issued within last three months  A document from Central/Local Government/Government Agency/Local	
Utility Bill UK - issued within last three months (Not a mobile telephone)	
Letter of sponsorship from future employment provider Non-UK or Non-EEA only; valid only for applicants residing outside of the UK at time of application - must still be valid	

## **Combinations of documents required:**

Route One - where the applicant can provide any documents from Group 1:
☐ 1 document from Group 1; <u>and</u>
☐ 2 further documents from Group 1 or 2a or 2b; one of which must verify your current address
Route Two - where the applicant cannot provide any documents from Group 1:
□ 1 document from Group 2a; <u>and</u>
$\hfill 2$ further documents from Group 2a or 2b; one of which must verify your current address; $\underline{\textbf{and}}$
The organisation conducting the ID check will then need to ensure an external ID validation service is used to check the applicant against their records to establish the applicant's name and living history footprint
If the applicant <u>fails</u> the external validation check, they will need to go for fingerprinting at the Police Station. This may add delay into the overall application process.

should have a discussion with them to establish why they could not meet these requirements and whether there has been a recent or previous change of name that has not been declared. For Route Three, the applicant must produce:
$\hfill \Box$ Birth certificate (UK and Channel Islands) issued after time of birth by relevant authority ; $\pmb{and}$
☐ 4 further documents from Group 2 comprising of:
☐ 1 document from Group 2a; <u>and</u>
☐ 3 further documents from Group 2a or 2b; one of which must verify their current address
If the applicant <u>fails</u> to produce the required document set at Route Three, they will need to go for fingerprinting. This may add delay into the overall application process.
